Introduction

Function of This Disc:

"Ceremonials" contains music that is required by regulation for military ceremonies. This disc is formatted for either direct use of a compact disc player or tape-dubbing. Use this recording when a military band is not available.

How to Use This Disc:

1. The user of this disc should consult the regulation that governs a specific ceremony. A list of regulations governing military ceremonies is printed in USCG COMDTINST 5060.11 or USCG COMDTINST 4001.1A regarding Bands. Contact your public affairs officer for additional guidance.
2. Military ceremonies follow a specific format. The user must program the compact disc player for the desired order of a specific ceremony.
3. When dubbing a tape, program the order on a compact disc player and record the ceremony. **Use the tape.**
4. Marches for gathering and departing are formatted for continuous marching between selections.

THE UNITED STATES COAST GUARD BAND

The United States Coast Guard Band was organized in March of 1925 with the assistance of some of the world's best military and civilian musicians - "America's March King" John Philip Sousa being, perhaps, the most worthy. On September 17, 1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed Congressional Legislation that resulted in the Coast Guard Band being the permanent, official musical representative of the nation's oldest continuous seagoing service. This event also established the Coast Guard Band as one of the five premier service bands in America.

Since 1925, when it was founded to fulfill the musical requirements of the United States Coast Guard Academy, the Coast Guard Band has developed an international reputation as one of the finest professional concert bands in the world, offering music of great variety and appeal. The band has released over fourteen record albums and furnished programs to National Public Radio for broadcast in over 150 cities in 42 states. Concerts are also broadcast in Australia, Japan and Europe. On June 22, 1989, the Coast Guard Band became the first American military band ever to perform in the former Soviet Union when it joined with the Leningrad (now St. Petersburg, Russia) Military District Band in a historic concert in October Hall.
