THE UNITED STATES NAVY MEMORIAL

The United States Navy Memorial in Washington, D.C. honors men and women who serve their country in the U.S. Navy - past, present and future. Dedicated in October 1987, the Memorial is located on Pennsylvania Avenue halfway between the White House and Capitol.

The Memorial includes a circular plaza bearing a 100-foot diameter granite map of the world, flag masts, fountains and a seven-foot statue of "The Lone Sailor" by sculptor Stanley Bleifeld. The plaza is the site for summer concerts by the U.S. Navy Band and other service bands.

In addition, an adjacent visitors center will open in 1990 containing a 250-seat theater and the Navy Memorial Log Room housing a computerized log of Navy veterans in whose name contributions have been donated to the Memorial.

Funding for the Memorial is solely from private contributions and all proceeds from this album support the Navy Memorial Foundation.
